Quentin Jackson, M.AIRAH, is an Associate – Sustainable Design Leader, Aurecon, Queensland, Affiliate Director at IBPSA, an Expert in Green Star Design and As Built – Expert Reference Panel, Australia. As an environmental modelling and sustainable design specialist with expertise in daylighting design and technology, productivity analysis and post-occupancy evaluation, Quentin specialises in designing buildings for improved indoor environmental quality. He has completed numerous pre- and post-occupancy evaluations throughout Australia and New Zealand using the UK-designed PROBE process. He is an assessor for the New Zealand Green Building Council (NZGBC) and was on the technical committee that developed the Green Star NZ Office Version 1, Industrial 2009, Interiors 2009 and Green Star Australia Communities rating tools. Quentin continues to work on the Green Building Council of Australia (GBCA) and NZGBC to help develop future tools.

Jeremy Mansfield has over 26 years' experience in the construction industry and for the past 11 years has been Sustainability Manager with oversight of all Lendlease building projects across Queensland and NT. Jeremy's career spans project management, design, planning and construction of public and private works. This includes major public buildings, healthcare projects, defence, maintenance facilities, offices, industrial and major retail projects. Jeremy is a member of the GBCA's Resilience to Climate Change Expert Reference Panel (ERP).
